Ch-1- Common Nouns and Proper Nouns

Common Noun

Definition:

A *common noun* is a general name for a person, place, animal, or thing. It does **not** begin with a capital letter unless it is at the start of a sentence.

Examples: Dog, City, Girl, School, Book

- The girl is reading a book.
- I saw a bird in the tree.

Proper Noun

Definition:

A *proper noun* is the name of a specific person, place, animal, or thing. It always begins with a capital letter.

Example: Sara, London, Shimba, Friday, Mountain Everest

- Sarah is my best friend.
- We visited **London** last year.
