- **Article “a”** is used before a **singular noun** that **begins with a consonant sound**.
- Examples: a boy, a cat, a pen, a table
- **Article “an”** is used before a **singular noun** that **begins with vowel sound (a, e, I, o, u)**.
- Examples: an ant, an egg, an igloo, an orange, an uncle
