LEARN

And, But, Or, So, Because, As, Since

We know that **conjunctions** are words that link sentences, words or groups of words together. **And, but, or, so, because, as** and **since** are some common conjunctions we have already studied.

For example:

- Sahil decided to buy the pink **and** the black shirts. (link words)
- I like coffee, **but** I don't like tea. (contrast)
- Susan missed the bus, **so** she took the train. (reason)
- You can play chess **or** ludo. (options)
- Samantha is late **because** she woke up late. (reason)
- He went to bed early **as** he had an exam the next day. (reason)
- She did not answer the doorbell **since** she was sleeping. (reason)

REMEMBER

Use of 'and'

Shelja is **hardworking** and **patient**. (joins two adjectives)

Megha and Kritika visited the zoo. (joins two proper nouns)

Meera and I are staying together. (joins a proper noun and a pronoun)

Agatha met me at the zoo though she does not like animals kept in cages.
