LEARN

Adjectives can describe different things about nouns.

- beautiful, terrible, smart, green, big, round

These adjectives tell us something about the nature of nouns. They are called adjectives of quality.

- many, much, some, enough, little

These tell us how much of a noun is being talked about. They are called adjectives of quantity.

- one, ten, million

These tell us the exact number of something. They are called adjectives of number.

- third, seventeenth, hundredth

These tell us the exact position of something. They are also called adjectives of number.

REMEMBER

- An adjective usually comes before the noun it describes.
For example: I have a green umbrella.
- Sometimes, an adjective does not come before a noun it describes, but follows a verb that comes after the noun.
For example: The cartoon was funny.
